There are lots of ways to get to this zoo. We can walk, take the bus, take the subway or ride in a car.





When we arrive at the zoo we might already have our tickets. The Admissions Building is the place I can ask to borrow a Sensory Bag if I need it for my visit. I can ask a Zoo employee for help if I need directions to find the building.



There are two parts to the Central Park Zoo, and each has a separate entrance: The "Main Zoo" and the "Children's Zoo".





If we get hungry or thirsty. We can go to the Dancing Crane Cafe. This is near the Main Zoo. There you can buy food or drinks.






The Gift Shop is also near the Main Zoo. The shop entrance is across the path from the Main Zoo gate.
